Rabies vaccination and dog license requirements

As required under the *Wisconsin State Statutes*, owners of dogs in the Town of Oshkosh must have rabies vaccination and be licensed.

Vaccination against rabies of all dogs by a veterinarian is required within 30 days after the dog reaches 4 months of age and revaccinate within one year after the initial vaccination. Older vaccinated dogs must be revaccinate when the certificate expires or within three years of the previous vaccination. Certificates of current vaccination by a veterinarian must be presented when obtaining dog licenses.

All dogs 5 months of age or older require a license. The license fee for neutered males or spayed females is \$3.00, upon presentation of evidence that the dog has been neutered or spayed, and \$8.00 for not neutered male or not spayed female dogs.

New residents of the town have 30 days to obtain a dog license.

Penalties

A late fee of \$5.00 shall be added to the owner of each dog 5 months of age or over who fails to obtain and renew his or her dog license by April 1st. An owner who fails to meet the dog licensing requirement by statute may be required to forfeit no less than \$50.00 nor more than \$100.00.

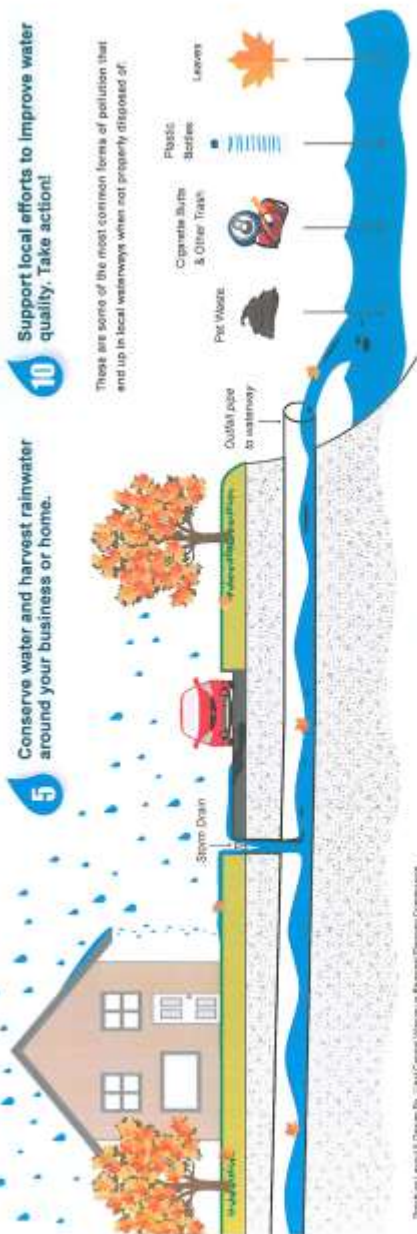
Clean Water Starts in Your Own Yard...

Water pollution has many sources. Up to half of all pollutants come not from factories or wastewater treatment plants, but from many diffuse sources resulting from our own everyday activities. For example, dog waste left on the ground or chemicals sprayed on lawns may get washed into the nearest waterways during the next rain event. Pet waste and pesticides in your yard may not seem like they could have a large effect on local streams and lakes, but our waterways receive stormwater from thousands of homes and businesses each time it rains. What we do in our own backyards and our communities can make all the difference to the quality of our lakes and streams.

Top 10 things you can do to keep area waters clean...

- 1 Be a pooper scooper and pick up after your pets.
- 2 Keep soil in your yard and out of our waterways.
- 3 Keep leaves and grass clippings out of ditches and waterways.
- 4 Kick your chemical dependency and consider non-toxic alternatives.
- 5 Conserve water and harvest rainwater around your business or home.
- 6 Don't overfeed your lawn with unnecessary fertilizers or chemicals.
- 7 Practice careful car care by properly disposing of harmful fluids.
- 8 Use a proper container for trash and recyclables.
- 9 Be a watershed watchdog and report potential problems.
- 10 Support local efforts to improve water quality. Take action!

Composting Recipes

Shopping List:

- ✓ Green yard waste: grass clippings, green yard trimmings, weeds and fruit and vegetable scraps.
- ✓ Brown yard waste: leaves, small brush and twigs (1/2" diameter or less), woody plant prunings, sawdust.

Lazy Person's Compost

Ingredients:

Mix one volume of green materials with two or three volumes of brown yard waste, water as needed.

Directions:

- In a heap or bin, layer your yard waste as it accumulates. For faster composting, chop it up first with a hoe or lawn mower.
- Water so compost is kept as moist as a wrung-out sponge, and turn periodically.
- In 6 to 18 months, the material at the bottom and center of the pile will be dark, crumbly compost. Sift, and use the uncomposted material to start a new batch.

Fast Compost

Ingredients:

Green and brown yard waste, water as needed.

Directions:

- Mix one part green yard waste with two parts brown to form a pile (an average size is 4'x4'x4'). For fast composting, chop it up first with a hoe or lawn mower.
- Mix in one inch of soil.
- Keep the pile as moist as a wrung-out sponge.
- Turn the pile every week to let air in.
- Finished compost will take between twelve weeks and one year, depending on how often you turn it and how well you maintain the moisture of the pile.

Troubleshooting

Symptoms	Problems	Solutions
Bad odor	Not enough air circulation, or too much green material	Mix the pile, or add in more brown material.
Composts too slowly	Not enough water	Moisten and mix the pile.
Pile is damp and warm only in center	Pile is too small	Collect more material and mix it into the pile.
Pile is damp and sweet-smelling but no heat	Not enough green material	Mix in more green material like fresh grass clippings, yard trimmings and weeds.

Composting Bins

Used Pallet Bin

Used pallets can easily be wired together to form a bin. Construct bins with removable fronts or sides so that yard materials can be easily turned with a pitchfork.

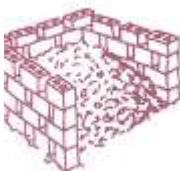


Woven Wire Bin

Purchase a length of woven wire and fasten the ends with several small chain snaps (available at any hardware store) to make a circle. To calculate the length of wire needed, lay a piece of string around the outside of the pile and measure it. (For a 4'x4'x4' compost pile, purchase 16 feet of woven wire.)

Block or Brick Bin

Pile up bricks, cement blocks, or rocks to form three sides of a square container. Lay the blocks without mortar, leaving spaces between to let air circulate.



What Can You Compost?

Do Compost

- grass clippings
- leaves
- straw
- weeds & garden debris
- small brush, twigs
- vegetable and fruit peels, cores and trimmings*
- sawdust & wood chips
- eggshells*
- coffee grounds, tea leaves & paper filters*

Do NOT Compost

- meat, bones, fat
- dairy products
- oils
- weeds gone to seed
- whole branches, logs
- pet or human waste
- charcoal briquette ash
- sawdust or ash from treated wood

Town Hall Rental

Wood Chipping April through October

Town residents may bring branches to the town hall on Saturdays only between the times 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. from April through October.

Branches must be 3" in diameter or less. There is a sign designated where at the town hall leave the branches.

Town residents are welcome to take the wood chips during the same time mentioned above on Saturdays.

It is **NOT** a dumping site for grass clippings or anything likewise. Only branches are allowed.

Violators will be cited.
